(Merced, Fresno, Kern, Kings, Madera, San Joaquin, Stanislaus and Tulare counties)

Project Goal

The San Joaquin Valley Regional Blueprint will create processes and products that support long-range planning for the eight MPOs in the region and that complement the work of the California Partnership for the San Joaquin Valley.

Project Description and Update

The Blueprint will identify issues related to future growth and subsequent impacts on the San Joaquin Valley. It will involve participation of local, state, and federal agencies, including organizations and individuals with land use, housing, transportation, environment and economic interests.

Public participation activities have produced visioning documents for each of the eight regions. This includes: goals and objectives, as well as defining evaluation criteria for comparing alternatives. Over the next few months the visioning documents will be presented to their respective governing boards for approval.

GIS traffic modeling tools were updated with traffic and demographic data to develop alternative growth scenarios, and to evaluate each scenario and related impacts.

Subsequently, the Blueprint Modeling Committee hosted a workshop to bring together environmental and resources agencies. The UPLAN Model was run to project status quo growth out to the year 2050. This collaboration between transportation, environmental and resources is intended to achieve a mutual goal of prioritizing areas of avoidance for future urbanization.

Draft performance measures have been identified for the areas of transportation, housing/jobs, air quality, agriculture land conservation, mass transit, and environmental conservation.
